B.A. Economics Programme Outcome

Keeping in line with the Vision and Mission of the College, the B.A. Programme's defined objectives are to:

- provide an in-depth knowledge in Economic Theory and give an exposure to real world applications.
- provide training in quantitative tools and core students to enable the students to pursue higher studies in researched based institutions.
- equip the students for placements in industries.
- shape the students into socially responsible and socially sensitive citizens.
- motivate students to appear for civil services and competitive examinations.
- prepare students for SLET and UGC NET examination

By including job oriented papers in the curriculum and by offering more quantitative techniques papers, the department's objectives of equipping students for campus placements and for pursuing higher studies in research based institutions are satisfied. By involving the students in extension activities through the Lions International Campus clubs, the objective of making students socially sensitive and responsible is also met. Learning outcomes are consistently monitored through series of one hour tests and through mid-term exams, and seminars and assignments and by tracking the number of students pursuing higher studies in premier institutions and in University departments. The course content of the programmes are tuned to meet these objectives through informal feedbacks from current students and experts. After getting feedback and a need based assessment, constructive suggestions are incorporated in the syllabi. This ensures that the programme objective of providing quality education is met.

The IQAC of the college also assesses the overall performance of each department through an internal audit conducted at periodic intervals all through the year. The under graduate course in Economics (B.A.) has been structured to satisfy both the supply side objective of liberal education as well as the demand side objective of imparting employable skills. The Department has identified the following specific objectives:

- To give the students a strong grounding in fundamentals.
- To equip them with quantitative skills

- To enhance their ability to analyze real world economic issues.
- To increase their competitive advantage for securing employment
- To alert their societal consciousness and prepare them to be better citizens.
- Inclusion of the latest information in the relevant field of study
- Making the courses job oriented
- Overall personality development of the students

The flexibility to frame the syllabus enables the fulfillment of these criteria. The Department has introduced many application and job oriented papers for the under graduates such as Micro Economics, Macro Economics, Environmental Economics, Corporate Finance, Portfolio Management and Insurance. The economics course under autonomy imparts rigorous training in quantitative tools to the students through the inclusion of papers such as Mathematical Methods, Statistical Methods, and Econometrics for both UG and PG students, spread over all the semesters. The inclusion of these papers has enabled our students to continue their studies further in esteemed research institutions in India such as Madras School of Economics. The highlight of the autonomous course is the inclusion of the project for U G which is optional for the U.G students giving them extra credit points. The U.G Course includes papers that facilitate job opportunities in Industries, Banks and Insurance Companies.

The B A. Economics programme in this college is thus a perfect blend of papers needs complementing each other to cater to the of the students. Part IV - Non Major Elective includes skill based papers such as Indian Constitution and General Knowledge and a paper on Analytical Reasoning (Levels, I, II and III) to give our students good foundation for facing Competitive Examinations like IES, IAS, and Nationalised Banks' recruitment exams (Banking Services Recruitment Board Exam). These papers are designed to suit the requirements of employment market based on feed back from the Placement Cell of the College. Apart from course content, the teaching and evaluation practice gives due credit for class participation and formal presentation
