Organizational Chart

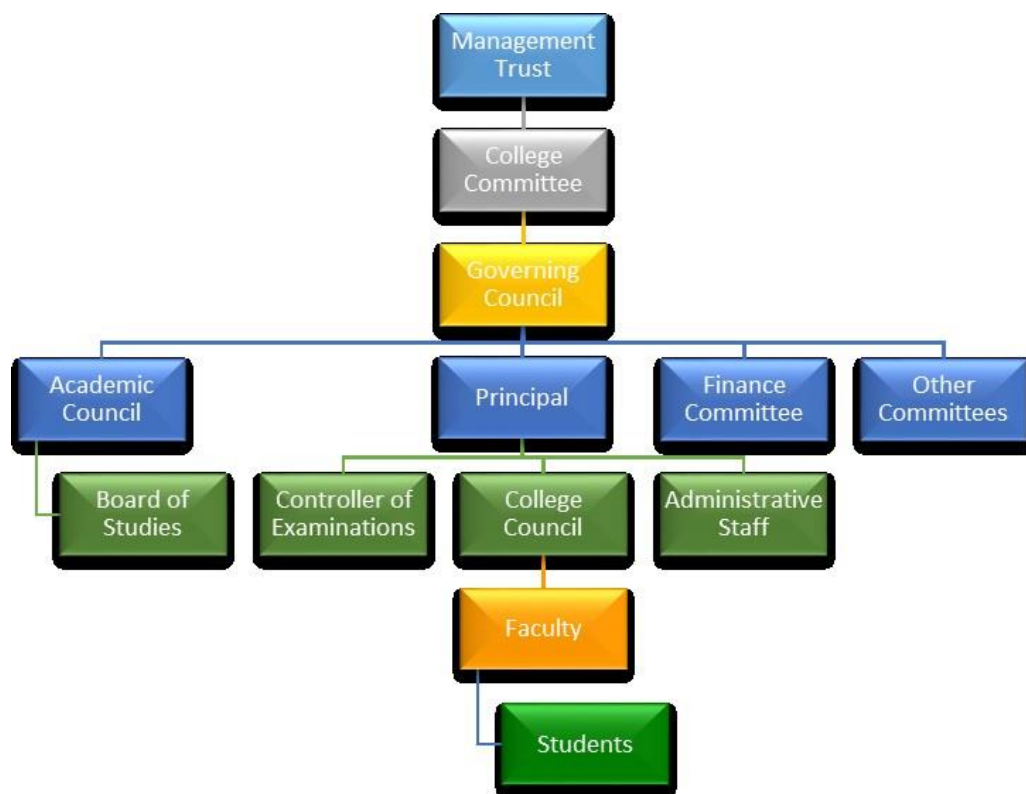


Figure: Academic Decision-making Hierarchy

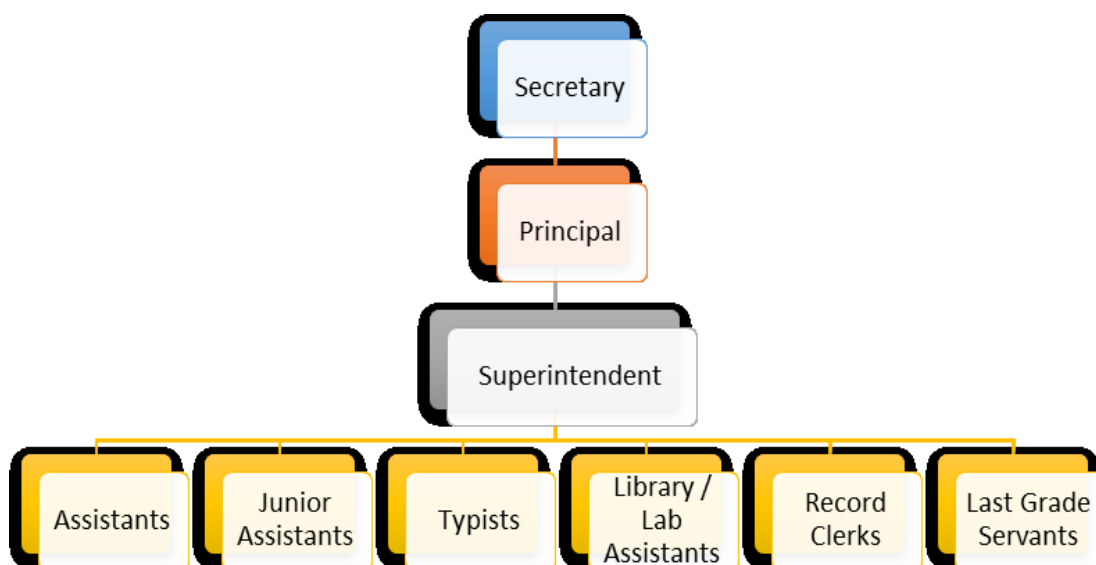


Figure: Administrative Decision-making Hierarchy

Nature and extent of involvement of Faculty and students in academic affairs/improvements

There is representation of faculty on the boards of statutory committees like the Governing Council, for staff from the administrative office and the teaching faculty from the science and humanities streams are inducted into these bodies.

The Management conducts staff meetings periodically to discuss various issues. The Secretary, Principal and the Placement Cell interact with industry representatives and based on their requirements, steps are taken to equip the students with appropriate skills. The Management also pursues opportunities to collaborate in various fields with industries and research organizations and to draw up MoUs with them for the benefit of students.

The Management involves Heads of Departments, the Students Union members, class representatives and assistant class representatives in discussions and decision-making involving conduct of cultural activities and other important matters relating to the students.

The outcomes of activities carried out at various levels are assessed periodically and necessary recommendations and constructive suggestions for improvement are taken up.

The Secretary and Principal conduct general assembly frequently where students are briefed on various important matters relating to academics and student discipline. Information is also shared on important matters relating to examinations and cultural events. They also interact frequently with student representatives such as the Students Union and class representatives, and obtain informal feedback from them.

The Faculty is required to continuously update their knowledge base to meet the requirements of the students and for their own self-development which in turn contributes to the overall development of the institution.

The Management facilitates frequent interactions among the faculty members and the administrative wing of the College so that knowledge is disseminated in both directions. Knowledge Management at the institutional level is facilitated to a large extent by the robust wired network infrastructure and the investment in state-of-the-art technology that the College has made.

Mechanism/Norms and Procedure for democratic / good governance

- To promote value-based quality education on par with the best institutions in the country and to provide experiential learning.
- To encourage collaborations with national and international research centers for collaborative research; to take up research projects on societal concerns in order to bring about societal change; to upgrade PG Departments into Research Departments.

Activities of the IQAC

• Academic Audits of Departments

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell conducts Academic audits of the departments annually through its two tools of Academic Progress Monitoring System for students and the Appraisal System for faculty. Reports of the academic progression of every student coupled with data on her social and economic background are generated automatically and reviewed regularly by the IQAC. Similarly, reports are prepared for each faculty member's activities and achievements in the year including academic results in the subjects she taught. Suggestions for quality improvement and the way forward are filtered out after discussions convened by the IQAC.

An external academic audit is also conducted periodically for every Department by subject experts invited from other organizations.

• Acting on the Recommendations of Academic Audits

Departments arrange for academic audits periodically while the IQAC conducts performance audits of all the departments based on student and faculty performances. On the basis of the recommendations of the Academic Audit Committee and the IQAC, various measures have been taken by the College to improve teaching and learning. Examples are the provision of intranet and internet facilities, signing of MoUs and introduction of interdisciplinary skill-based subjects like Quality Control Circles, General Knowledge and Analytical Reasoning for all courses.

• Review of the Teaching-Learning Process

Structure: The Internal Quality Assurance Cell is the body that reviews the teaching-learning process. The IQAC team consists of the following members:

The Principal is the chairperson of the IQAC. The other members comprise two management representatives, two senior administrative officers, six members of the faculty, one representative from the community and the Coordinator who is overall in-charge of the functioning of the IQAC.

Methodology: The IQAC has applied quality parameters for the various academic and administrative activities of the college. It has organized workshops and seminars on quality-related themes as part of staff enrichment programmes. It documents all the activities of the College and steers the College towards quality enhancement, facilitating the internalization of a quality culture. It prepares and submits the annual Quality Assurance Reports based on the identified quality parameters. To improve the quality

of teaching, periodic feedback is also obtained from students apart from periodic review of students in internal tests.

Outcome: Consequent to the setting up of the IQAC in 2006 and its post-NAAC initiatives after the last NAAC accreditation, a definitive quality improvement in all spheres of institutional activity, especially in teaching, learning and evaluation, is discernible. The process of documentation, planning, feedback and corrective action have become part of the routine and a culture of quality has been internalized in the functioning of the institution.

- **Institutionalizing QA Strategies and Processes**

The IQAC monitors the quality parameters and ensures that the standards of excellence reflected in the vision and mission of the college are met and continued. It has institutionalized a number of quality measures in the academic and administrative sectors. Techno-centric and student-centric teaching-learning, Academic Audit, Feedback mechanism and Quality Circle activities involving the students and the staff are only some of the initiatives of the IQAC for bringing about quality initiatives in the institution.

- **Study on Students' Academic Progression**

The IQAC has developed the Academic Progress Monitoring System and Faculty Appraisal System detailed in Criteria 2 and 5. These systems serve as mechanisms that help to systematically review and monitor student progress and faculty performance, and to take remedial action to help students better their performance.

The Academic Progress Monitoring System provides automated reports about each student's academic progression over the semesters and also gives information about the students' social background. After the examination results are released after every examination, the system also provides useful data regarding arrears of students along with their social and economic status as supporting data. The system mandates the recording of reasons for the students' failure in each subject by the subject teachers and the HoD and identification and implementation of remedial measures in consultation with the IQAC, to help the student study and perform well in the supplementary examinations.
